Definition




- Traumatic Wound: a wound or laceration of traumatic origin with no evidence of contamination or signs of active infection.
- Dirty Traumatic Wound: a wound or laceration of traumatic origin that is contaminated. The risk of infection is high.
- Infected Traumatic Wound: a wound or laceration of traumatic origin with signs of infection (secretions).

Risk Factors



• Patients with multiple comorbidities are at higher risk for poor healing.



Dressing Options

Maintain proper moisture balance








• Weekly follow-up visits until healed


